A MESSAGE FROM DEIDRE ANDERSON

Dear UICS Friends,

Our mission began in the basement of St. Mark Union Church decades ago with advocacy for local families. We were called into action again as our city presented voters with an opportunity to provide universal pre-K education, through an April 2019 ballot tax proposal. It brought out the best in our work, where The Kansas City Star cited UICS as "...a prime example of the kind of pre-K centers that education and city officials say they want for all four-year-olds." Unfortunately, the measure failed, but citizens became aware of this important work for our city's future.

Despite this result, we continued to find ways to reach more students. New and creative artists engaged in month-long residencies in our classrooms. Innovative pre-K partnerships were developed with four charter school partners (Crossroads Academy, Citizens of the World, KIPP, and University Academy), creating our largest rising "graduating class" ever. This integrated approach to education creates continuity for families and informative access for educators.

Last, but not least, we expanded for the first time in our half-century history. At 39th & Troost, you can find UICS-Metro Center. In a partnership with the KCATA, we brought our capacity to 225 students, reducing a heavy wait list. So, as we've grown, we've stayed grounded in our roots, with our second location providing transportation access and quality early education to advance families.

We're excited to share the stories of our year. Thank you for your continued support of our students, teachers, staff, and families.

Answering the call of opportunity: UICS-Metro Center expansion

When opportunity knocks, it's best to answer the door.

Just as when our organization was founded more than 50 years ago along Kansas City's 12th Street corridor and our flagship UICS-St. Mark Center blazed a trail of educational opportunity in 2004, opportunity called again.

This time, the spirit of collaboration led to a partnership with the Greater Kansas City Area Transportation Authority (KCATA) to open a second location at 39th and Troost.

"This opportunity to serve more families and young students is one that can change the narrative for a generation of lives," says UICS CEO Deidre Anderson.

"In a city where only 34% of four-yearolds are enrolled in a quality pre-K program, UICS will meet needs that transcend economics and social structure."

The center, which opened in September 2019, has capacity to serve 124 students ranging in ages from six weeks to five years.

In addition to easing transportation hurdles with a major KCATA bus stop right outside our doors, UICS-Metro continues a legacy of exceptional learning to neighborhood families and beyond!






