

# Jennie & Nicholai: An EarlystART family makes positive strides in stability, strength, and healthy development.

"I can't do this alone," says 28-year-old Jennie, a single mom to little Nicholai who attends EarlystART North Center.
"I am truly thankful and blessed to be a part of this," she says of her EarlystART "family".

"I've been on my own since I was 17 years old. In the last two years, I was able to dig deep to get myself where I am today," she says of her journey to overcome childhood trauma, drug addiction, and a series of unhealthy relationships.

"Nicholai has connected with everyone at EarlystART. Seeing his face light up in the mornings and how joyful he is - it makes my heart so happy!" says Jennie.

Kim Logston, EarlystART North Center Assistant Director, is a special source of encouragement and support for Jennie. "If I'm having a bad day, I can open up to her. I can share my struggles and my accomplishments and, either way, I am accepted." In accessing important community resources, Jennie has been able to achieve stability with housing and finances, and also maintain a healthy lifestyle.

In reflecting on how far she's come, Jennie says, "Resilience has become my new favorite word."



**In 2021, EarlystART was born!** It's a vibrant new identity that we embrace in gratitude for those who planted our roots and a community that continues to support our vital work.










